As psychology continues to be one of the most progressive and relevant of the modern sciences, it is more than ever necessary for psychologists to keep attuned to research and theoretical developments in the field. In our psychological community, the Philippine Journal of Psychology seeks to serve as the vehicle for the communication, dissemination, and exchange of information on the state of the science. In this capacity, the Journal welcomes submission of articles in the following categories:

1. Empirical studies
2. Methodological articles
3. Case studies of high quality
4. Literature reviews
5. Monographs
6. Papers expressing an idea, a definition, or a concept
7. Short critical notes written in the scholarly tradition
8. Rejoinders that lead to the solution of problems
9. Book reviews

Manuscripts submitted will be evaluated carefully by the Board of Editors and at least one referee who shall be chosen from among the Fellows of the Psychological Association of the Philippines with expertise in the area covered by the article. Generally, the editors will reach a decision on a manuscript within three months of the date of submission.
